

How to setup groups

Step1: Click "Tools", and select "Setup Class" from drop down menu.

Step2: In "Class/Teacher Setup" window, choose the class that you wish to separate into groups. And click "Setup Group" button.

Step3: In "Setup Group" window, click "new group", then the second (2) group will be shown on the left column.

Step4: Select the group 2 students in sequence from the pool of group 1 by dragging the students from the right (group 1 column) to the left (group 2 column). Repeat the process for setting up group 3, 4, and more groups.

Step5: After completing the process and back to "Class/Teacher Setup" window, the students have been divided into groups. Click "sort again" button and you can choose the sorting order by group, or by student ID.

As the group setup completed, starts the evaluation system and choose group method for assigning different colors for each group on screen.

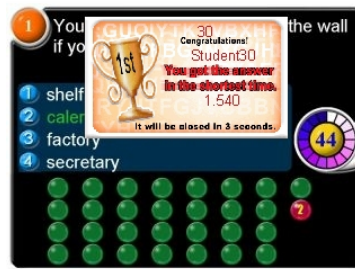
To start the **QA competition**:

Step1: Starts EduClick 2.0 and clicks "Run" on the menu bar and choose "QA competition".

Step2: Once the "QA competition" window appears, having the students hold the remote controls. Instructor can press "5" to start.

As the question appears on the screen, the system will initialize count down, or wait for the instructor to press the key. The goal is for students to answer the questions in the earliest possible time. Once the question has been answered correctly, the following windows will appear on screen with the student's name and time (in seconds). The screen will stay on for 3 seconds, and instructor can press "5" to continue.

In class application	Note
Competition activity: whole class answering competition.	Some students may not have the chances to answer questions.
Group competition: For each question, after the group discussion, then entering the contest. 1.Representative answering: only one of the team represents the group for answering the question? 2.Group answering: after the group discussion, all members of the team compete for answering the question.	Only the group representatives' answer the question, most students has to wait for their turn. However, the chance for group answering the question is more evenly distributed.
Based on the contents, the students or the groups can create their own questions, so that the test can more student oriented, and they can exchange the questions among them.	Instructor need to set up the standards for grading: 1. The accuracy of the question and answer 2.The other team gains points when the answer is correct.



As the last question has been answered, the instructor can press "5" to quit the exam, or press "7" to view the report screen.

While no correct answer is provided within the answering period. The following screen will show and instructor can press "5" to continue to the next question. At the end of question period, instructor can review the result.



Right Competition

Similar to "QA Competition", students have to compete for the right to answer. With instructor's acknowledgement, student will answer the question verbally.

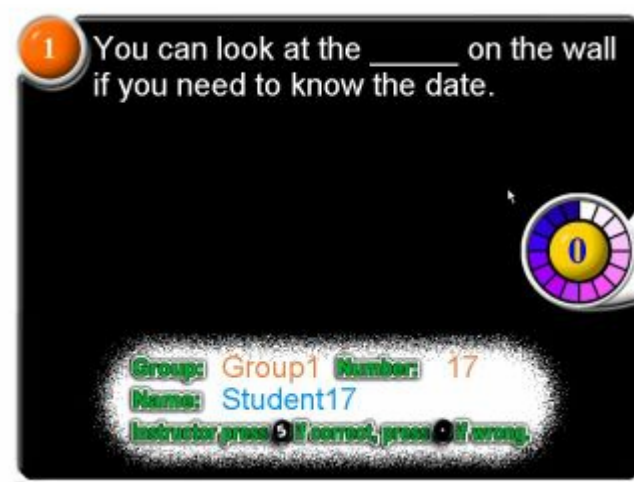
To start the right competition:

Step1: Click "Run" from the menu bar, and choose "Rights Competition" from drop down menu.

Step2: As the "Right Competition" windows appears, have the students hold the remote control, and instructor presses "5" to start.



As the question period starts, the one who presses the remote control key first gain the right to answer. The information of student who has the right to answer will be shown on the screen. The student can answer the question verbally, the instructor may ask additional questions as well.



If a right answer is provided, instructor will press "5" and a "Scores" window will appear. To go to the next question, instructor presses "5". If "." is pressed, it indicates that the answer is wrong and all students can join. The right competition resumes.

As the question period ends, the instructor can press "5" to stop or press "7" to view the report.

During Right competition, the text format question will only show the stem.

Prompt QA

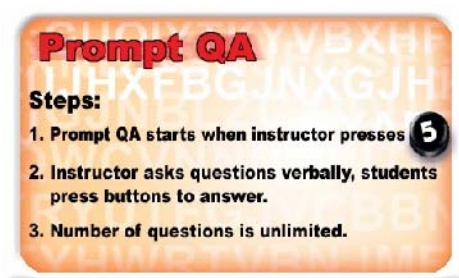
When instructor wishes to have verbal questions or gain insight of students' opinions, these activities are not included in the predefined question set, "Prompt QA" can help the instruction in this situation.

In class application	Note
Self-evaluation: focusing on certain subjects for self-evaluation	Instructor can understand students' needs of learning.
Peer-Evaluation: Focusing on project or activities for peer-evaluation. 1.Focus on each subject's grade - self-evaluation? 2.Focus on whole class performance for evaluation 3.Focus on the whole class performance for grades	Focus on different activities or projects, instructor should design different grading standards.
Vote: focus on one subject and proceed with voting.	Applicable anytime for convenience.
Election 1.Model student 2.Student council 3.Special assignment	Shorter vote-counting time to increase the number of candidates.

To start prompt QA:

Step1: Click "Run" from the menu bar and choose "Prompt QA" from the drop down menu.

Step2: Once the "Prompt QA" window appears, instructor can press "5" to start the "Prompt QA".



Once the "Prompt QA" window appears, using verbal or other communication methods, instructor can start asking students question, student's answering status will be shown on the button of the screen. EduClick 2.0 logs each student's answer (the red circle indicate the student has answered the question). There is no predefined number of questions for prompt QA, instructor can press "2" to skip to the next question.



The prompt QA session is similar to the QA competition except that there is no actual question shown on screen. You can view statistic chart, individual student's answering status, or review records.

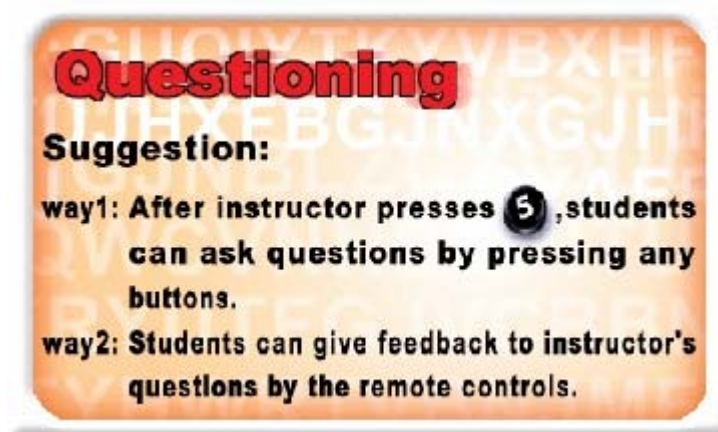
Questioning

In class application	Note
Questioning: determine the order of questioning.	Depends on the classroom atmosphere and timing, instructor should not apply "questioning" to completely replace the instructor's decision. As a result, some students lost the chance to answer.
Prompt right competition: Instructor asks the questions, and uses the questioning method for prompt right competition.	

To start Questioning:

Step1: Click "Run" from the menu bar, and choose "Questioning" from drop down menu.

Step2: As the "Questioning" window appears, instructor presses "5" to start "questioning".



Students may use their remote controls to ask questions. When the button is pressed, the student's ID will be shown on screen so that the instructor knows who is asking the question.
